JOURNAL WRITING:

Have you watched a good movie or read an excellent book? In seven to ten sentences, write about the important things that happened on the show or in the book. Be sure to tell who the story was about, what the character did, when and where the action took place, and why it happened.

CRAFTING THE LESSON:

(Me)(We) The teacher will tell the students that a summary is shorter than the original story and includes only the most important information. A reader can summarize a selection by restating the author's main idea in as few words as possible. The summary includes "who the story is about, what the person did, when it happened, where it happened, and why it happened. The teacher will read a passage from the story. The teacher will ask, "Who is the passage about? What did the character do? When did the character do it? Where? Why?

COMPOSING MEANING:

(Two) The teacher will pair the students and give them worksheet 34. The students will tell the "who, did what, when, where, and why" of the passage. The teacher will call upon volunteers to share their responses.

(You) Give the students worksheet 35. They will tell the "who, did what, when, where, and why" of the passage and then write a news article about the event.
